
1. Configuring Windows

1.1 Opening Credential Manager in Windows


STEP 1

Click **[Start]** → **[Control Panel]**.



STEP 2

Select **[User Accounts and Family Safety]**.




STEP 3

Select **[User Accounts]**.



STEP 4

Select **[Manage your credentials]**.




1.2 Remove credentials

STEP 1

Select the Windows Credentials that you want to remove. (In the example below, 172.16.4.101 is the credential for our NAS).

Store credentials for automatic logon

Use Credential Manager to store credentials, such as user names and passwords, in vaults so you can easily log on to computers or websites.
